




China's Aerospace Structure





Growing Aerospace Market

- 2nd largest aerospace market
- → 7-11 % annual growth predicted for next 20 Years
- → Chinese airlines expect to triple their fleets in the next 20 years, this represents roughly 5,000 new aircraft:
 - → Large passenger aircraft 3400
 - → 870 twin aisle aircraft
 - → Regional jets 700
 - → 600 Business Jets




Challenges

- Competitive market place








